

ORDINANCE NO. 96-007 340.2**AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO
DIRT, EARTH AND/OR DEBRIS
DEPOSITED UPON A STREET OR HIGHWAY**

WHEREAS, in the interest of public safety certain regulations are necessary, proper and required for the prevention of dirt, earth, and/or debris upon public highways in Scott County, Kentucky, and

WHEREAS, the Scott Fiscal Court, in order to promote the public safety of the citizens of Scott County and safe traveling thereon under the powers granted the said court by KRS 67.083

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SCOTT COUNTY FISCAL COURT OF SCOTT COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: Any and all dirt, earth and/or debris from any real estate improvement within the county shall be kept and/or transported in such manner that it will not wash, drain or otherwise be caused to enter and be deposited in or upon any county street or highway, sewer or other drainage facility of the county.

SECTION II: Any person, persons, partnerships, corporations, contractors and/or builders who displace or relocate or cause to be displaced or relocated any dirt, earth and/or debris from any real estate improvement and such displacement or relocation places the dirt, earth or debris in such a manner that it washes, drains or is caused to enter and be deposited in or upon the county street, highway, sewer or other drainage facility of the county, shall forthwith remove and relocate said dirt, earth and debris to a safe location and shall clean up or cause to be cleaned up said dirt, earth and debris within 24 hours.

SECTION III: Any person, persons, partnerships, corporations, contractors or builders violating any provision of the preceding sections shall be guilty of a

misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$500.00. Each day during which such violation shall continue shall be considered a separate offense.

SECTION IV: This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication.

WHEREUPON, this Ordinance, after being duly read, was given first reading on July 22, 1996; second reading passed and approved on August 5, 1996.
